1,528,320 TOTAL PIECES OF LITTER

Across all of our programs, our amazing community of volunteers helped us remove over 1.5 million pieces of litter from the environment this year.

74+ COMMUNITIES CLEANED

We completed cleanups in over 74 distinct municipalities and townships this year, mainly throughout Ontario but across Canada as well.

5,250 **VOLUNTEER HOURS**


650+ volunteers contributed over 5,000 hours to keeping their local environment and waterways litterfree.

REACHING MILESTONES

2021 was our most impactful year to date, all in thanks to our community of volunteers, donors, and supporters. A Greener Future saw the development of new programs, new community partnerships, and an ever-growing community of volunteers that all helped to amplify our impact this year. With the help of 665 individual volunteers, we were able to pick up more than 6 times the amount of litter compared to 2020 and host litter cleanups all across Canada.

FOR **EVERY HOUR** SPENT PICKING UP LITTER IN 2021, OUR STAFF AND VOLUNTEERS DIVERTED APPROXIMATELY **380 PIECES OF LITTER** FROM THE ENVIRONMENT.

Despite a year of more change, we have learned that we can truly make a difference when we all work together as evidenced by our data. We are so thankful for our dedicated volunteers, amazing partners, and supportive donors for helping make this kind of impact possible. We can't wait to see what the next year brings with our community's continued support!



TACKLING CIGARETTE LITTER, TWO TIMES OVER

Cigarette butts remain the most littered item in the world. These small filters have a huge environmental impact, with just one cigarette butt polluting over 130 chemicals into our waterways. Outside of our cigarette butt-specific cleanups, this form of smoking litter makes up over **20%** of the total pieces of litter we find. This year, we hosted not one, but two month-long Butt Blitz campaigns in April and September to tackle this prevalent pollutant.

OUR VOLUNTEERS DEDICATED **2,500+ HOURS** THIS YEAR TO PICKING UP CIGARETTE BUTTS FROM THEIR COMMUNITIES.

We were fortunate enough to host a public cleanup in September which was joined by the provincial Environment, Conservation, and Parks Minister, David Piccini. To expand our impact, we were also able to develop a Butt Blitz Action Toolkit for volunteers to continue tackling cigarette litter year-round!



Kyra's team was one of many that surpassed 30,000 butts over the course of one month; the Collingwood and Port Hope teams succeeded in collecting over 50,000 butts in September!

Volunteer Spotlight Roger Davidson

Since April 2021, Roger has contributed over **94 volunteer hours** picking up litter - and that's just through our programming! In reality, Roger gives back to his local ecosystems every day. Roger told us that four years ago he had "stumbled across a dead Great Blue Heron along the shoreline of a local pond. Curious about why it had died, [he] used sticks to open it up and found dozens of cigarette butts and plastics in its stomach." This experience inspired Roger to begin picking up litter on his daily walks.

WITH HELP FROM HIS LAB BOSCO, ROGER COLLECTED **42,615 CIGARETTE BUTTS** DURING 2021 BUTT BLITZ PROGRAMMING.

It is truly remarkable to see the difference Roger is making in his community, as he has been awarded both the Citizen of the Year Award (2019) and the Environmental Impact Award (2019) in Stouffville.

Through his volunteer work with A Greener Future, Roger enjoys meeting people on his walks and inspiring them to start picking up litter as well. He loves our Butt Blitz program as it helps motivate people to clean up their environment and also raises awareness around how deadly cigarette butts can be. Roger tells us that the most rewarding part of picking up cigarette litter

is knowing that the butts he has removed from the environment have saved countless birds from being poisoned, and knowing these butts will also be recycled into something useful is doubly rewarding! Roger has truly gone above and beyond during our Butt Blitz program - in September he picked up more butts than any other volunteer.

Love Your Lake

PROTECTING LAKE ONTARIO IN NEW WAYS

Our Love Your Lake programming looked a little different this year...again! Unable to host public litter cleanups due to public health restrictions, we recruited 88 dedicated volunteers to complete litter cleanups along their favourite shorelines on Lake Ontario. And the results were incredible!

We cleaned the original 100 Love Your Lake locations alongside many more beautiful parks and beaches. As a result, this was our most successful Love Your Lake program to date! We picked up lots of foam, plastic, and cigarette butts from the shoreline. However, we also saw notable increases in P.P.E. litter and single-use Food & Beverage plastics, such as to-go cups and food packaging. 119,112 PIECES OF LITTER



OF THE TOTAL LITTER COLLECTED DURING LOVE YOUR LAKE WAS STYROFOAM PIECES. 25,759 pieces of foam were removed from just one shoreline location in Trenton this year. Foam breaks down into microplastics when exposed to the elements and is often ingested by wildlife. It is also extremely difficult to remove from the lake as it easily crumbles into small pieces.Unfortunately, it is very common to find foam in Lake Ontario as it is used in the manufacturing of dock floats.



SUP WITH LITTER

Hosted in partnership with Lake Surfistas, ThursoSurf, and ROXY, this river cleanup was a day of fun in the sun for volunteers. We had volunteers join us from across the GTHA to remove all sorts of litter from the Humber River in Toronto.

TRASH OR TREASURE?

Every year, we pick up tens of thousands pieces of litter from the shoreline of Lake Ontario. There are many ways to repurpose the litter we find with the right skills. This year, we recruited 11 talented artists from around the Greater Toronto Area to turn trash into treasure by creating pieces of art from the litter we collect. We have many amazing projects already underway, and we are hoping to display this creative and meaningful artwork next year at a public gallery event - stay tuned!

KEEPING THE BRUCE TRAIL BEAUTIFUL

Working in partnership with community groups of the Bruce Trail Conservancy, A Greener Future helped in the development of a Bruce Trail Cleanup Program this year. Running from May until September, **51 volunteers** participated across Ontario in trail cleanups to remove **18,591 pieces of litter** from the Bruce Trail. This program involved individual cleanups, community Trash Talk Cafés, and public Enviro-Hikes hosted by Bruce Trail Ambassadors.

SHORELINE The Paddle Against Plastic

In the summer of 2020 Rochelle Byrne undertook an amazing feat - she was going to stand-up paddle across Lake Ontario. With the pandemic stifling plans to run public litter cleanups, Rochelle took to her paddleboard to try and make a difference. SHORELINE: The Paddle Against Plastic is a documentary that follows the story of A Greener Future's Executive Director, Rochelle Byrne, as she embarks on a 430 kilometre paddle journey across Lake Ontario to raise awareness about plastic pollution under the looming shadow of the COVID-19 pandemic. 2021 saw the completion of the documentary SHORELINE, and A Greener Future hosted premieres across communities in the Great Lakes region. This fall was SHORELINE's world premiere and the film is now available to watch for free on A Greener Future's website and YouTube channel. Screenings can also be arranged for businesses, schools, and community groups, with an additional cost for Q&A with A Greener Future's Founder, Rochelle Byrne.




